Kiwanis members are educated on the current risks of cyber attacks

At the October 9 meeting, Steve Woods, the founder of Tech4Life, presented tips on cyber safety and how to avoid being hacked.

Tech4Life is a company that helps their clients retrieve back their damaged data after they have been hacked.

Woods offered some helpful tips. First of all, do not save passwords to websites. Also, do not answer emails from corporations, because most will probably not email you directly, so this could be a hoax.

Tech4Life is offering two upcoming classes at the Desert Foothills Library on how to prevent being hacked on October 23rd at 5:00 p.m. and November 19th at 9:30 a.m. Interested parties can sign up at dfla.org.

Woods believes that affluent households and small business owners are prime targets of hackers, and should definitely assess what their current risks are. There are protections, and it can be very expensive to retrieve the data back that has been damaged by the hacker. In addition to the two library classes being offered, clients can also schedule an appointment with Tech4Life. They also offer personal assessments for people and their businesses on the likelihood of their personal information being hacked. Clients come away with a full understanding of their risk and a prioritized list of action items to help minimize security risks.
