Our guest speaker on March 3, 2023 was Megan Peterson Boyle, DMD, a Scottsdale dentist who, eighteen years earlier, was a Kiwanis college scholarship recipient. Megan was a senior at Cactus Shadows HS in 2005 when she was awarded a \$12,000 scholarship, which enabled her to attend the University of the Pacific. She then enrolled in dental school and received her DMD degree and license in 2012. She began practicing with Dr. Mark Peck and quickly became a partner. When Dr. Peck retired in 2020, Megan bought the practice, named Dental Studio 101. In addition to general dentistry, Megan specializes in aesthetic and full- mouth rehabilitation.

Deeply committed to her patients and the community, Megan has gifted \$15,000 to Kiwanis, to be added to our scholarship funds. Megan's gift adds a new twist to old adage "give and you shall receive"; Megan received from Kiwanis, and has given back. Megan's gift exemplifies the best of the people in Kiwanis!

Wayne was a fixture at the Kiwanis Market Place store where he gave countless hours and years of volunteer work offering help and a free smile to everyone he met. He did not know a stranger. He was a true gentleman, always respectful and genuinely nice, kind and a loving person who was friendly with all he met.

He recently was recognized by the Marketplace with a *Volunteer Appreciation Award*. Wayne was a fixture in Kiwanis for 16 years and dated back to the early days of the "Parking Lot Sales." Way before "The Marketplace Store" existed, he arranged furniture on the parking lot on sale day and priced items.

When the first tiny store opened, next to the parking lot, Wayne was very active in getting it set up. He later helped design the



layout of the Marketplace Store that we are in today, with the metal shelving and gondolas. Since the opening of the Marketplace, Wayne has overseen pricing and merchandising of the furniture. You could catch him with a rag in his hand or back pocket, zipping around the store and cleaning furniture as the Roadies dropped it off. Wayne was known as the eager guy who always kept his head on straight. He made himself available to talk and help figure out any issues that needed to be addressed. The Marketplace would not have the success we enjoy today, without the commitment and support of Wayne. And for that and so much more, the Club is eternally grateful.
