INSTITUTE FOR HEALING OF MEMORIES

I am sure that Spirit in the Desert Retreat Center has sent you an official acknowledgement of the generous gift by the Carefree Kiwanis Club for partial funding of the Healing of Memories Workshop for Women Veterans on November 21-23, 2025, but I want to send a personal thank you, your leaders, and members for this generous donation.

We have been conducting this workshop at Spirit in the Desert Retreat Center since October 2013. Both the qualitative and quantitative evaluation results continue to be consistently positive with over 90% saying that the workshop was a good or excellent step in their healing journey. As you know many veterans have come back home suffering from the psychological and spiritual wounds of their military experiences. This is especially true of women veterans, many of whom suffer from the effects of military sexual trauma (MST).

This workshop is one of the few in the country that deals with the purging of buried memories of pain that have been controlling many veterans' lives. We know from the research that unless these wounds are healed, the person's family, especially the children, are affected negatively. In fact, the mental health and suicide rate for children of veterans with PTSD is much higher than the national average.

Because of your donation and that of other generous organizations and people, we are able to continue to offer this workshop free of charge to our women veterans.


Lisa and her husband have two daughters and four grandchildren.

As part of the Hospitality Committee, Lisa works to ensure the weekly member meetings run smoothly and helps raise money for the Club through her work on fundraising events like the Annual Pancake Breakfast. On the Foundation Board, she sees first-hand the substantial impact Kiwanis has on local non-profit organizations and children in the area. As part of her Board duties, she has approved thousands of dollars of grant funds that support children's programs, including those at the Valley of the Sun YMCA and the Desert Foothills Library.

During her career, Lisa served as a Master Sergeant in the Washington Air National Guard, both as a traditional guardsman and a full-time military technician. She deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and performed military training in Spain, Korea, England and Japan.

Lisa has seen firsthand how joining Kiwanis is a great first step in meeting new people, giving back to the community and learning of other non-profit organizations with volunteer opportunities.
