PETE CARPENTER

The “Pete” Carpenter Story (1939-2025)

Peter Rockefeller Carpenter was born and raised in Sunbury, PA. Pete attended Sunbury High School, Mercersburg Academy and Pennsylvania State University where he was a member of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity and earned a BA degree in 1962. Pete served for 4 years in the U.S. Naval Air Force, including a tour in Southern Florida during the Cuban Missile Crisis.

Following his military service, Pete enjoyed a 35 year career in the insurance and financial services sectors, earning the Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award for his leadership and contributions in his field. His most recent position was Vice President of Private Client Services at Wells Fargo.

Pete was a champion of civic involvement, serving his community in a number of roles including Lieutenant Governor and President of KIWANIS International, 32nd degree Mason of the Ancient York Scottish Rite, Chairman of Gompers Rehabilitation Center, Arizona Alumni Director for Penn State University and council member for Ascension Lutheran and Christ the Lord Lutheran churches. He was also an active member of the Scottsdale Chamber of Commerce, Valley of the Sun United Way, Boys and Girls Club of Greater Scottsdale and the Maricopa County Sheriff's volunteer posse. The KIWANIS FAMILY will miss Pete's kindness, grace and wisdom.

Pete is survived by his 3 children, Karen, Jean and Peter, and 7 grandchildren. Pete was married to Janet Buck, who predeceased him in 2011.

I first met Pete while serving on the Winfield HOA Architectural Improvement Committee. As a senior member, he took me under his wing, showed me the ropes, and introduced me to the committee's lively personalities—especially the friendly football banter between Penn State-proud Pete and a Michigan alum. He brought humor to almost every home-improvement request that came our way.

I was especially struck by his Kiwanis dedication. Pete recruited more than 300 members, started three new Kiwanis clubs in Arizona, and launched Circle K, Key Club, and Builders Club programs. After moving to Winfield and joining the Carefree Club, he served as Membership Chair and brought in another 30 members. His recruitment motto was simple: "Just ask—ask someone every week." And he meant everyone: barbers, butchers, doctors, lawyers, church friends, Masons, and bankers.

Over his 50+ years of Kiwanis service, Pete earned the Distinguished President and Distinguished Lt. Governor awards. He also served as Host Chair for the 1984 International Kiwanis Convention in Phoenix. His son Peter proudly continued the family tradition as the first president of the Scottsdale Airpark Kiwanis Club.

Pete Carpenter set the example for me when he first asked me to join—and his legacy and motto should live on in all of us. We will truly miss him. **Bob Moore**
